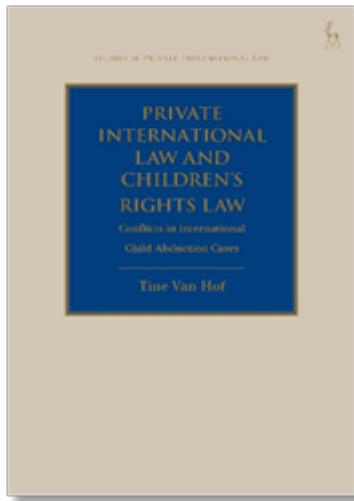


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Tine Van Hof is a legal researcher at the University of Antwerp, Belgium.

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
