CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

ARTICLE 1.

Within the activities of the Jean Monnet Module “CoME CircLE” (*Consumer and Market Law in the European Circular Economy*), the Department of Legal Sciences of the University of Udine (Italy), together with a consortium of European universities including University of Essex (UK), Universitatea de Vest din Timisoara (Romania), East Anglia University (UK), University of Belgrade (Serbia), University of Rijeka (Croatia) and University of Szeged (Hungary), organises the 19th edition of the Summer school *Consumer and Market Law in the European Circular Economy*, to be held 8-17 July 2026 in Udine (Italy), at the Campus of Legal and Economic Sciences.

The Summer school is a blended intensive course (40 hours of lectures (8-10 July online / 13-17 July in presence), a workshop and a moot court), held in English by internationally renowned academics. It addresses theoretical and practical issues related to the legal protection of consumers and the market regulation in the European Circular Economy. The scientific coordinator is prof. Elisabetta Bergamini, full professor of European Union Law at the University of Udine.

The available places for enrolment to the Udine Summer school are 40. 15 places are reserved for students from non-partner universities, graduates who graduated no more than five years ago, PhD students, who will be selected on a competitive basis. At the end of the course, students who have attended at least 90 percent of the scheduled hours and pass the final exam will receive an attendance certificate. Students from other Universities (depending on their home institution) may be able to translate their participation into ECTS points.

ARTICLE 2. Admission requirements

The course is targeted to undergraduate students, graduates who graduated no more than five years ago, PhD students from faculties of Law, Economics, Political Science or International Relations. Applicants must demonstrate proficiency in English in order to meet the entry requirements (minimum ability level for non-native speakers: B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). Proficiency in English must be certified (e.g., by providing TOEFL or IELTS scores or any other certificate issued by either a University or a certification body).

A general knowledge of European Union Law and/or International Law is compulsory and must be proved through a transcript of record attached to the application.

The entry requirements must be met within the set deadline for the submission of applications.

ARTICLE 3. How to apply. Selection criteria

Students who are interested in applying to the Summer School must fill in the application form at the end of this document and submit it to ip.europeanlaw.uniud@gmail.com. The following documents are requested: a curriculum vitae, a motivational letter (max 300 words), the transcript of records (including exams and marks) and a copy of the identity card or passport.

A ranking list will be drafted by a Commission composed by two Professors of the Udine Summer School on the bases of the academic qualifications held by the candidates, in order to ensure the maximum transparency.

The Commission will take into consideration for evaluation and selection purposes:

A) The weighted average mark (at the moment of the submission) (max 15 points)

B) Curriculum vitae (max 10 points)

The Commission will take into account training experiences e.g. periods of study and internships carried out abroad (in particular, Erasmus projects and study trips), as well as candidates' organisational and relational skills, such as the ability to cooperate and to work as part of a team.

C) Certified language skills (max 5 points)

- Only certified language skills will be evaluated (priority will be given to those skills certified according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Language).

In the event of an equal score, the younger candidate will be preferred.

The ranking list will be communicated personally to candidates at the email address used to submit the application.

In case of renunciation of one or more applicants or extension of the available places for enrolment, those who ranked next highest to the selected candidates will be given the opportunity to join the programme. Failure to complete the application form will result in the automatic exclusion from the selection.

ARTICLE 4.

Payment

Application deadline is **31st May 2026, 12:00 pm GMT**. Applications received before 30th April 2026, 12:00 pm GMT will benefit from the early-bird registration fee.

The tuition-fee will include accommodation costs in a single room at the University residence from 12 July to 18 July 2026 and ten meals at the University canteen. **No tuition-fee would be applied for students selected by partner Universities in the framework of the consortium agreement.** All travel costs are at students' expense.

Annex 1 – Consent to use personal data

Information in accordance with the Legislative Decree no. 196/2003 – Code on personal data

Purposes of the processing

In accordance with the section 13 D.lgs. n.196/2003 the provided data will be processed in the necessary measure and for the purposes connected to the enrollment and the attendance to the training course.

Methods of processing and subjects involved

The processing will be done both manually and by computer. The data may be communicated to institutions or public and private authorities if strictly necessary for the scope of the teaching activities of the course.

Nature of the provision of the data and consequences of a potential refusal

The provision of the data is mandatory, and the potential refusal of the provision involves the impossibility of the enrollment in the course and the management of the connected procedural activities, as well as the teaching activities.

Holder and supervisor of the processing

The holder of the processing of the data is the Università degli Studi di Udine represented in person by its pro tempore legal representative, the Magnifico Rettore, domiciled for the role at the university's headquarters. The supervisor of the processing is the Scientific Coordinator of the Summer School.

Section 7 d.lgs. 196/2003 – Right to Access Personal Data and Other Rights

- The data subject shall have the right to be informed

- a) of the source of the personal data;
 - b) of the purposes and methods of the processing;
 - c) of the logic applied to the processing, if the latter is carried out with the help of electronic means;
 - d) of the identification data concerning data controller, data processors and the representative designated as per section 5 paragraph 2;

- The subject shall have the right to obtain
- a) updating, rectification or, where interested therein, integration of the data;
 - b) erasure, anonymizing or blocking of data that have been processed unlawfully, including data whose retention is unnecessary for the purposes for which they have been collected or subsequently processed;
 - c) certification to the effect that the operations as per letters a) and b) have been notified, as also related to their contents, to the entities to whom or which the data were communicated or disseminated, unless this requirement proves impossible or involves a manifestly disproportionate effort compared with the right that is to be protected.
- The subject shall have the right to object, in whole or in part,
- a) on legitimate grounds, to the processing of personal data concerning him/her, even though they are relevant to the purpose of the collection;
 - b) to the processing of personal data concerning him/her, where it is carried out for the purpose of sending advertising materials or direct selling or else for the performance of market or commercial communication surveys.
